

I used to work at a tiny college in rural Vermont. Our students were from traditionally underserved, underrepresented, and underprepared populations. If they didn't make it in our school, they weren't going to make it in college.

There was one student who will always stand out to me: Ellen from New York. Ellen was tough, and she made sure you knew it. Ellen was a bipolar addict, who strutted around campus reliving glory days of being a high school bully, regularly self-destructing in and out of the classroom. Chaos just followed Ellen. She was also a gifted writer, fiercely passionate, a talented singer, and incredibly loyal.

Ellen was a regular guest in my office for a variety of reasons. Sometimes to tell me about the girl she concussed in high school, sometimes to share with me the poem she wrote. Sometimes she was in trouble, sometimes she gave me the scoop from the weekend. Sometimes she just wanted a Jolly Rancher. Ellen drove me nuts, but I had a soft spot for Ellen.

Because Ellen also loved Scrabble.

Scrabble is my game. I grew up playing with my grandmother, but never really found any other good opponents because it's not a game teenagers and 20-year-olds played in the 2000s.

When I found out Ellen played Scrabble we made it a regular thing to play. Every Thursday night after supper, we'd meet in the lounge outside my apartment to play a game. There were a few times I tried to bail because I wanted some alone time, but sure enough Ellen would knock on my door and ask if I was scared to face her that week

We talked about a lot of stuff in those games. Things going on at home, things scaring her about the future, the trauma she'd endured growing up, why she liked to write, who she had a crush on that week. Sometimes we wouldn't talk about anything, sometimes she'd just sing.

People on campus found out we were doing that and said, "I was doing a great service." I didn't think I was doing anything special. I was just playing Scrabble with someone who also liked to play Scrabble.

But after we played for a few months, Ellen seemed different. I noticed Ellen didn't use as much. Ellen didn't self-destruct as much. Ellen didn't create as much chaos. She was just easier to get along with. Was I responsible for that? Absolutely not. I think Jesus put me in the right place at the right time for Ellen. I think Jesus knew that the most important thing for Ellen was to have someone she trusted, to connect with, and build a relationship with.

Jesus does care about the ministry, but the ministry is the relationships. Ministry without relationships is community service. And look, there's nothing wrong with community service. In fact, I think it's great. **But it's not the only thing Jesus calls us to.** When we're doing ministry-and we are all capable of doing ministry-we should be asking ourselves, "How, if at all, is this thing moving people closer and closer to Jesus?" And if we're not moving out of the box of "doing a great service," then maybe it's time to reexamine **what we're doing.**

We cannot build a kingdom, we cannot share the joy and power and love of Christ without building relationships with the people around us, the people we're serving, and the people we're in community with. We GET to share what we have found in Christ everyday, and people will keep coming back because of the relationship, not because of the service.

My encouragement to you is to believe in your ability to have impact and influence beyond the service, and think deeply about those God has placed in your heart to build a relationship with.

Zion's going GREEN! It's time we take notice of the waste we contribute to our world. The plastic bags, the plastic bottles, even our paper use. The average office generates 1/4 pound of paper per employee, per day. That adds up to a lot of paper over a year...and a lot of trees used and spent energy too! Most of our used copier/printer paper, notepads, catalogs, cardboard boxes, outdated phone books and more could be recycled, instead of just going to waste. Zion Lutheran has set a goal of reducing the amount of waste for disposal by 60 percent by the year 2024. It's a great goal that preserves both resources and our local economy, helps our community become more sustainable, and helps us live into one of our baptismal covenants: to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. We will also launch a waste prevention program to help us cut back on the amount of waste we generate in the first place.

THIS IS HOW *YOU* **CAN HELP:** Join Zion's **GREEN TEAM!** Our team will be responsible for initiating ways to recycle and help with delivering our recyclables to the centers. Zion is also encouraging YOU to start or continue recycling at home! Carry a reusable water bottle. Say no to disposable straws and cutlery. Store leftovers in glass jars. Bring your own shopping bag (Zion is going to help with that!). Energy saving tips include using a programable thermostat or adjusting temps at night and when you are out of the house, switching your light bulbs to Energy-Efficient, unplugging small appliances until you really need them, and taking steps to weatherize your home.

During the month of March you can bring your plastic grocery sacks to Zion for recycling. We are also continuing to collecting new or used ink cartridges. Collection box is in the office! A few small changes to old habits and we can all be proud of the difference we'll be making to help keep our community beautiful and our church thriving. Thanks for participating! 
