More than a century ago, Martin Buber worried about a crisis in modern life: how would increased alienation and "social distance" of modern societies affect the well-being of humanity? How might his writings help us reflect on the consequences of "social distancing" during the current pandemic and appreciate the value of the communities in which we live and serve?
